

The Impact YOUR Donation Made

"It was really nice the other day. I took my daughters to the park, and we met another mother and child that was the same age. It is was first time I introduced myself and family as a neighbor, and not as a person needing help."

- Single mother of two (she had been in the program just two months at the time). She was freed of her abusive partner, started working, and completed her High School education in order to start higher education. It didn't take long for her to understand what she wanted to do, and how important this change was for her own confidence and self-perception.

"I never thought I would be able to do this"

-Single mother of 2 boys in our New Foundations program. She was homeless and living in an unfit mobile home awaiting the arrival of her baby. Her older son, age 8, had been in state's custody for four years. She applied to NF, was accepted, and moved in one week after the birth of her son. Soon after moving in, she was granted overnight visits with her older son. After six short months in the NF program, she retained full custody of her 8 year old son. She is living independently with her children for the first time in her life. She began her college career this summer. She has overcome mental health and substance abuse issues to become a strong independent mother of two happy healthy boys.
